Who should attend:

A Temporary Traffic Operative who wants to gain the TMO Practicing Warrant.

Goal of the course:

To maintain the TTM worksite, install and remove a worksite, and undertake an inspection activity (US31960).

At the end of these sessions the TTM Operative will have completed:

- 3 practical sign offs for the following closures with a mentor
 - » Shoulder
 - » Berm activity
 - » Footpath control
 - » Inspection activity
- Three alternative techniques for dealing with conflict, for example:
 - » Listening
 - » Offering a solution
 - » Remaining calm
- 3 practical assessments on the following with an Assessor
 - » Set Up a closure
 - » Undertake an inspection
 - » Maintain a closure on the live lane
 - » An example of dealing with conflict
 - » Set up & Maintain a closure on shoulder or Berm

Prerequisites:

You must be a current STMS, Cat A, B or C; or evidence the student holds "US31959: Demonstrate knowledge of stakeholders and operational requirements for temporary traffic management."

Duration:

Estimated time for practical sign offs would be dependent on closure scheduled with Mentor Estimated time for practical assessments with Assessor: 4 hours

Qualification:

Waka Kotahi New Zealand Transport Agency issue a warrant for this position. This will expire every 3 years: The TMO practising warrant is renewed once the TMO practical re-assessment has been successfully completed. The practising warrant will expire on the same date as the nonpractising warrant.

US31960 will be credited to the individuals NZQA record of learning
